Denominational Update **Ordination Change Is Official**

On May 10 the 87th Presbytery of the Presbyterian Church (USA) voted in favor of new language to replace the existing requirement in the church Book of Order that officers of the church live in fidelity in marriage or chastity of singleness. That vote represented a majority of the 173 presbyteries of the denomination. The change does not become official until July 10. This is one year after the adjournment of the last General Assembly when the overture was initially approved.

Here is the official statement on this new position from the session of SPC.

In response to the recent change in the standard for officers in the Presbyterian Church (USA), the session of Spotsylvania Presbyterian Church expresses deep sadness and concern. Removing the requirement that leaders of the church should live in either “fidelity in marriage or chastity in singleness” reflects a view that is inconsistent with the teaching of the Bible. It also represents a departure from the witness of historic Christianity through the ages and separates the denomination from the vast majority of Christians around the world who do not support this view. Likewise, Spotsylvania Presbyterian Church does not share the views of the PCUSA in this matter and will continue to fulfill its vision of graciously reaching out to all people while affirming the standards of the Bible regarding morality and the nature of marriage.

In addition, the session would like to convey to the congregation that the new standard on ordination of leaders challenges our ability to fulfill our mission. The session believes this new situation is not tenable for the long term health of the church and some form of change is required. Please visit the church website at www.spcontheweb.org for additional background information on this matter.

Much has already been shared with our congregation about the background to this change and why it is significant. Let me add just a few highlights.

First, this decision does not require churches to make any immediate change in their practices and leadership.

Although the way ahead may seem challenging, we can move forward together in the future God intends for us trusting His timing and making deliberate decisions.

Second, since people have been asking about what we will do or can do, let me assure you that the membership of the church will be fully involved with decisions regarding the future of our church. Dramatic changes cannot be implemented by the pastor or session in this matter. So you will have opportunity to speak and vote as options are considered in the future.

The Jr. WAY children turned the tables on me not too long ago! These are young children, preschoolers and kindergarteners. Recently one of our Jr. WAY teachers had surgery and would be away from us for an extended amount of time. (Great chance to jump in and lend a hand everyone!) Normally the children are excited and animated, even goofy at times, but not that day. I started to explain the situation and immediately their tone turned serious, concerned, and compassionate. When I asked what God would have us do for our friend, the first response quickly came from a 5 year old boy who said "Pray."

After our discussion we made cards. Each child went right to work. A few had never met the recipient. They asked me to show them how to write her name and then they did their very best to write her name and their name on their cards. At one point I just stood in amazement as I watched this spiritual moment happening before my eyes. God was using these little children to minister to someone in need and through their attitudes and actions they were ministering to each other - and to me. It was amazing. God is so good! Children's ministry is so vital!

I will always keep all of you in my heart and prayers.

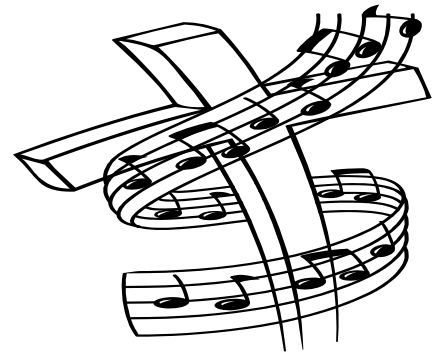

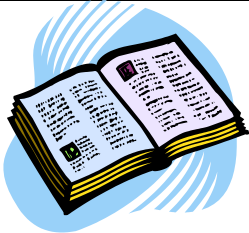

Cogitating on the Confessions

By Session

The Westminster Confession of Faith, written in 1646, is designed to help us better understand our God and our faith. While not the infallible, it seeks to summarize the key themes of the Bible, the complete and inerrant word of our Lord. We invite you to read and study this month's excerpt from the confession, review its associated scripture, and mediate on the security of our Lord Jesus Christ's loving hand.

The Westminster Confession

Chapter 6.1 - 4: Of the Fall of Man, of Sin, and the Punishment Thereof

Our first parents, being seduced by the subtlety and temptations of Satan, sinned, in eating the forbidden fruit.¹ This their sin, God was pleased, according to His wise and holy counsel, to permit, having purposed to order it to His own glory.²

By this sin they fell from their original righteousness and communion, with God,³ and so became dead in sin,⁴ and wholly defiled in all the parts and faculties of soul and body.⁵

They being the root of all mankind, the guilt of this sin was imputed;⁶ and the same death in sin, and corrupted nature, conveyed to all their posterity descending from them by ordinary generation.⁷

From this original corruption, whereby we are utterly indisposed, disabled, and made opposite to all good,⁸ and wholly inclined to all evil,⁹ do proceed all actual transgressions.¹⁰

This corruption of nature, during this life, does remain in those that are regenerated;¹¹ and although it be, through Christ, pardoned, and mortified; yet both itself, and all the motions thereof, are truly and properly sin.¹²

Every sin, both original and actual, being a transgression of the righteous law of God, and contrary thereunto,¹³ does in its own nature, bring guilt upon the sinner,¹⁴ whereby he is bound over to the wrath of God,¹⁵ and curse of the law,¹⁶ and so made subject to death,¹⁷ with all miseries spiritual,¹⁸ temporal,¹⁹ and eternal.²⁰

Be sure to sign up for any of these activities you want to attend. The sign up sheets are on the bulletin board in the children's wing.



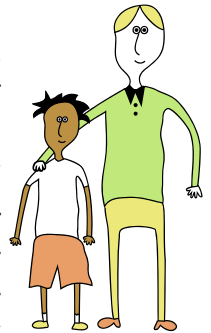
Now Recruiting Summer Sunday School

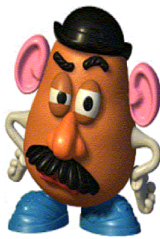

Fundraiser Report

Camp and mission trip information went out to parents in the mail recently. If the balance that you owe for your son or daughter's summer trip seemed a little lower than you expected, thank Mr. Potato Head...or your kids, or anyone who attended the Baked Potato Luncheon May 1! More than 150 people attended and nearly \$1300 were raised. Over 25 students assisted in one way or another. This allowed the Youth Ministry Volunteer Committee to do several things.



All 27 students going to Ligonier this summer received \$10 off the cost of camp. But those who participated in fundraising received a \$40 discount. This was in addition to the "families with multiples" discounts already given when folks registered in March.

With regard to the high school mission trip it was previously estimated that each individual student would need to pay \$200 in order to cover the cost of van rental, fuel, insurance, etc. But the fundraiser freed up cash in other places, allowing us to apply \$1000 toward the trip, so now each student will need to pay \$129. That's quite a cut!

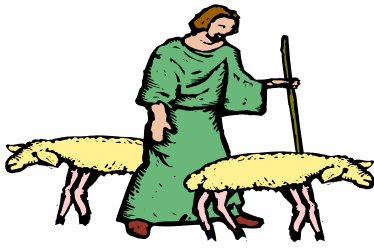

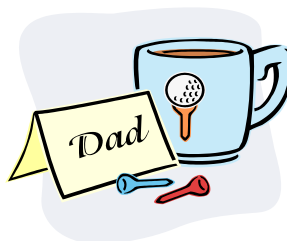

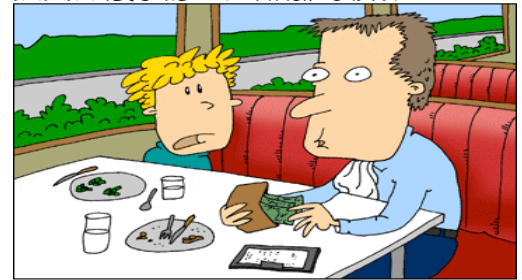
